It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas, and next week all our staff and students will Step Into Christmas and enjoy a well-earned rest with friends and family. As we reach the end of a busy term it is a great opportunity to look back (maybe not as far back as Last Christmas) and share some highlights from the last 15 weeks.

A very 'Positive' term

Since we returned in September, we have had nearly 270, 000 positive points awarded to students in recognition of their conduct, in and around school. There have been 6, 000 Exceptional Learner tokens given out with 70 students being awarded the weekly Headteacher award. We are exceptionally proud of the ways students have demonstrated the 5 R's each and every day this term, and we look forward to even more rewards being given in the new year.

Rossett on tour

In this first term we have been on lots of visits and trips. Not only have our students had wonderful experiences, but they have also acted as great ambassadors for our school. September saw some of our students enjoy a 'fantastique' trip to Northern France and staff were so proud of their exemplary behaviour, positivity and how much they embraced the Rossett 5 R's.

Students from KS3 and KS4 made the trip to London for a two-day performing arts experience, which included a guided tour of the National Theatre and a workshop at Pineapple Studios with a West End performer. In the last few weeks, Year 8 students have been to see the Lion, Witch and the Wardrobe at the West Yorkshire Playhouse, and Year 10 and 11 drama students have been to Leeds Grand Theatre to see Blood Brothers.

Although it wasn't A Fairytale in New York, our American Exchange was further strengthened this term with another successful visit to Falmouth Middle School.

The Elite Skills Day took our Year 10 students out of their comfort zone and helped develop skills that will serve them well, now and in the future. The army gave us some fantastic feedback, praising our students for their engagement, politeness, and positive attitude.

The recent Careers Fair gave all our students the chance to meet over 40 employers, colleges and universities and be inspired about the world of work. Many of our visitors commented on how polite, inquisitive and engaged students were, and they were thoroughly rewarded with lots of freebies!

It was great to see our Year 9 team win the Yorkshire LEAP competition this month. The four girls were given their prize at the Yorkshire Business Awards for demonstrating skills in sales and marketing, problem solving, finance and production. This was an amazing achievement.

We are also proud of the 200 Rossett students who took part in the Yorkshire Ambulance Service's Restart a Heart campaign, and it is great to know that many of our young people have these important first aid skills.

Celebrating success

At the end of November, we celebrated the Class of 2024 at our presentation evening. The evening was thoroughly enjoyable and a great reminder of all the hard work, effort and commitment of our students during Year 11. We also had a talk from Richard Sheriff, CEO of the Red Kite Learning Trust, about his recent ascent up Kilimanjaro and how making the first step on a journey is as important as the destination.
